

Hi everyone,

I wanted to share some information regarding Exam #1. Before I do, I want to share some good news about tonight's lecture. For those who were at our live online lecture, you know that my tablet froze partway through the lecture. Luckily, the video autosaved before my tablet froze, so there is a link to the video and notes on the course website. The video is only missing about a minute of lecture, although the PDF notes have everything. Since my tablet was frozen, the video doesn't have any of the information I provided about Exam #1, although there is some information starting at the 38 minute and 26 second mark of Tuesday's lecture video. Some of what was discussed about the exam on Tuesday and tonight is below.

- The exam will be proctored online through ProctorU. The exam will be taken through ALEKS but will be password protected and the only way to access the exam will be through ProctorU.
- Within 15 minutes of submitting your exam, you need to take pictures of your work and email it to me to grade. As I mentioned, a correct answer without supporting work may lose points and an incorrect answer with supporting work might earn points.
- Since we didn't get to finish section 4.7 this evening due to my tablet freezing, we'll finish that section on Tuesday, have the exam review next Thursday, and then you will be able to take the exam any time between Friday, 10/2 at 12:00am and Wednesday, 10/7 at 11:45pm.
 - Note that I was originally planning to allow the exam to be taken until Wednesday, 10/7 at 11:59pm, but ProctorU doesn't have that option or any option after 11:45pm.
- I was originally planning on allowing everyone two hours and forty minutes to complete the exam, as I mentioned during class. Unfortunately, CSN's contract with ProctorU allows a maximum of two hours, so that's what the exam time is set to. As I mentioned, the exam will be designed to be completed in one hour and twenty minutes, which is the normal class time, so you will still get one and a half times more than the normal class time, which is much more time than should be needed to help ensure that you can take your time and don't need to rush or put pressure on yourself due to time.
- I am going to work on the exam review this weekend and will send out more information about that once I'm done creating it.
- If you haven't already done so, I highly recommend reading the [information about and instructions for live online proctoring through ProctorU](#) document I posted on the course website, including the clicking on and reading the links within the document. Most of the information in that document is provided directly from ProctorU.

I will send out more details and information this weekend, but I at least wanted to get this information out to you all tonight. I hope you all have a great weekend!
